You have agreed to have your information referred to a staff attorney for Oregon Law Center who is funded through a grant with OHCS.

You do not currently have an attorney. You will need to go through an intake process to determine if there are any conflicts of interest

and if you financially qualify for a free attorney.

If you do not wish to go through the intake process, you can contact the Oregon State Bar Lawyer Referral Service at 1-800-452-7636

to get the names of private attorneys in your area who take housing cases. The attorneys have agreed to an initial consultation for \$35.

Any additional work after the consultation will be at an hourly rate.
